Danville School Building Committee Project Ideas - Updated 5/3/23

The following is a list of project ideas shared in meetings that address space issues at the school.

- 1. Using Community Buildings: Hold school events, drama, or move an entire class or multiple classes to a space outside of the school in the community
 - Pope Library's Community Center: Has a kitchen and bathroom and has been used for CCSU and principal meetings. The space is available to the school and has about 900 sq ft, 30'x30'. Discussion on whether the space is 900 sq ft, agreement that it is at least 600 sq ft.
 - Town Hall: School events or drama could be held at the Town Hall
 - Space at churches: Many are already being used during the week
 - North Danville School: ADA compliance and drainage issues
 - Masonic building: Downstairs is rented, and the upstairs wouldn't be adequate

2. Additional Structure On-Site:

- New structure for the high school
- New structure for elementary school (Grades 3 / 4 mentioned)
- New structure for pre-school
- Possible locations: Bus loading area, basketball and tennis courts, or by the yurt
- Possible structures
 - Framed construction
 - Modular
 - Temporary structure
 - Building green
 - A structure that is less expensive and can be used as a flexible space to change with the school's needs.
 - Permanent structure
